Applicants should hold a Ph.D. in Applied Linguistics, though consideration may be given to those nearing completion of a Ph.D., with a strong or promising research record and a clear demonstration of teaching excellence. A combination of education and experience will be considered.

Experience working, teaching, or living in a First Nations environment and ability to speak a First Nations language are considered assets.
