

About the Conference

With its title **MultiPluriTrans. Emerging Fields in Educational Ethnography**, the Luxembourgian conference picks up tendencies in ethnographic research which deal with the translocality and plurality of educational realities, with the multilingual, multicultural and multimodal conditions of pedagogical practice, and with the complex relations between local practice and national/global transformations and policies.

The conference aims at exploring the innovations, potentials and ambiguities of these research strategies and asks for their specific empirical and theoretical contributions to educational science.

The conference in Luxembourg further enhances the international exchange between ethnographic researchers in educational science which was established in Zurich (2006) and continued in Frankfurt (2009) and Erlangen (2011).

Mit dem Titel **MultiPluriTrans. Emerging Fields in Educational Ethnography** knüpft die Luxemburger Tagung an die Tendenzen in der ethnographischen Forschung an, sich der Translokalität und Pluralität von Erziehungswirklichkeiten, den multilingualen, -kulturellen und -modalen Bedingungen pädagogischer Praxis sowie den komplexen Relationen von lokaler Praxis und nationalen/globalen Transformationen und Politiken zuzuwenden.

Die Tagung zielt darauf, die Innovationen, Potentiale und Ambivalenzen dieser Forschungsstrategien auszuloten und fragt nach dem spezifischen Beitrag, den sie zu Empirie und Theorie in der Erziehungswissenschaft leisten.

Die Luxemburger Tagung setzt den 2006 in Zürich begonnenen und in Frankfurt (2009) und Erlangen (2011) fortgesetzten internationalen Austausch unter Ethnographinnen und Ethnographen in der Erziehungswissenschaft fort.


