Online Master of Education—TESOL Cohort

The Master of Education (M.Ed.) in Curriculum and Instruction (C&I)—Teachers of English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL) cohort targets K–12 and adult practicing/experienced educators with specific emphasis on English as a Second Language (ESL) instruction. This online M.Ed. TESOL cohort option is designed to prepare students to foster the English language development of English learners in a variety of settings within K–12 and adult education. Prescribed courses may be waived or substituted with committee approval, based on student experience and previous training or demonstration of required skills.

This 36-semester hour graduate cohort option in Curriculum and Instruction is designed to develop effective teaching and research tools that increase educational opportunity and workplace access. Traditionally, the M.Ed. TESOL cohort in Curriculum and Instruction has developed curriculum theories, pedagogical content and teaching strategies. This distance education option will continue with these themes.

Admissions

All candidates are required to complete and return the following items to the Office of Admissions:

- ★ TAMU graduate application and processing fee (\$50 for U.S. citizens or permanent residents; \$75 for international applicants)
- ★ Official transcripts from universities indicating previous degrees awarded
- ★ Official TOEFL scores taken within the last two years (international students only)

In addition, the Department of Teaching, Learning and Culture requires the following:

- ★ Departmental application (tlac.tamu.edu/admissions/ graduate-admissions/med-and-ms-admissionrequirements)
- ★ Three letters of recommendation
- ★ Minimum GPR of 2.75
- * The GRE is NOT a requirement

Applications to M.Ed. TESOL cohort are accepted for the Spring semester of every year. Only applications completed by the deadline will be submitted for review.

Application Deadlines

Summer: March 1st

Additional Information

Duration: The Online M.Ed. TESOL cohort is a two-year cohort.
