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CLINICAL ASSISTANT PROFESSOR POSITION in TESOL

The Department of Language and Literacy Education at the University of Georgia invites applications for a **Clinical Assistant Professor in TESOL**. The position begins in August 2015. <u>Clinical faculty</u> members are full-time faculty members eligible for promotion who have a strong academic background, professional experience in K-12 contexts, and a commitment to teacher education (learn more at: http://provost.uga.edu/documents/uga-clinical-guidelines-appt-promotion-11-28-11.pdf.

This clinical position is affiliated with the TESOL and World Language Education focal area (TWLE), which has a dynamic and diverse faculty who work closely together. The position includes teaching online and face-to-face courses within the candidate's area of expertise and coordinating an ESOL endorsement program. - Interest in clinical fieldwork, teacher education programs, and school-university partnerships.

Responsibilities:

- Teach undergraduate and graduate courses for candidates seeking an endorsement and/or initial certification in TESOL;
- Provide instructional leadership and mentoring to part-time instructors of ESOL endorsement and certification courses;
- Advise undergraduate and graduate students in the program and communicate with the undergraduate advisor in Student Services;
- Contribute to administering endorsement and certification programs;
- Maintain working relationships with local schools.

Application Procedure: Please submit applications as a single PDF file that includes (1) a letter of interest, (2) a current curriculum vitae, (3) one sample course syllabus related to TESOL area of expertise, (4) teaching evaluations. Please use "Clinical TESOL Search" in the subject line of your submission. A transcript from the applicant's terminal degree institution will be required from finalists.
