

Clinical Assistant/Associate Professor in TESOL, Non Tenure-Track and MA TESOL Program Coordinator New York University Shanghai Campus

The <u>Program in Multilingual/Multicultural Studies</u> (MMS) within the <u>Department of Teaching and Learning</u> at New York University will be launching a new MA degree program in TESOL for teachers of English in China beginning in Summer 2017 at NYU's Shanghai Campus. MMS is seeking a candidate to fill a full-time position as Clinical Assistant/Associate Professor in TESOL and MA TESOL Program Coordinator who will be based at NYU's Shanghai Campus beginning January 2017. The program will be delivered in a combination of in-person and online instruction.

Responsibilities: The ideal candidate will be someone who can successfully carry out the following responsibilities:

Teaching, programming, and scholarly activities

(1) teach a range of graduate courses in the areas of second/foreign language theory, practice, and research; (2) advise graduate students; (3) coordinate with New York-based faculty and staff in course and program development and curriculum planning; (4) maintain active involvement in the scholarly community through participation in professional organizations and conference presentations.

Administrative duties:

(1) Spearhead recruitment and program promotion in Shanghai; (2) hire adjunct faculty to teach graduate courses in Shanghai; (3) serve as a liaison to local education agencies; (4) collaborate with NYU Shanghai administration, faculty, and staff; (5) review program applications: (6) organize advisement and orientation sessions for incoming and continuing students; (7) assist with other MMS China-related programs and projects.

Qualifications: Earned doctorate in TESOL, Applied Linguistics, or related field; demonstrated commitment to, and expertise in, teaching at the graduate level; advanced proficiency in Mandarin and English; experience working internationally and/or with Chinese students.
