



COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Is this a gathering for Shoshone people only?

NO—This gathering is for all Uto-Aztecan Tribes who have a history with the Shoshonean Language Family. There are nine language families that Tribes identify with. The Shoshonean Language Family is just one of them. See list of related Tribes on left side of poster.

What kind of gathering is this? The gathering will consist of many cultural and traditional activities—see poster. The main goal is to share our similarities in language, culture and tradition and pass this knowledge to the People, especially our youth.

Who can participate? Any interested youth or adults are welcome to participate. We will have presentations for youth and adults.

Does it cost any money to participate—are there any registration fees? NO—this is a FREE gathering. There are no fees required. All we ask is that you submit a registration form so we know how many people to plan for (meals and activities).
