The [Department of Psychology](#) at the University of California, Santa Cruz invites applications for a tenured Professor in quantitative psychology. The position requires expertise in cutting edge quantitative methods and complex statistical modeling, and in teaching statistics at the graduate and undergraduate levels. Because the position also entails developing and directing the newly formed Center for Statistical Analysis in the Social Sciences (CSASS), we seek candidates with administrative experience and facility with acquiring extramural funding. The role of this new center is to stimulate and support research within and across social science disciplines (including collaborative research and research designed to inform public policy) and to facilitate expanded and enhanced instruction in quantitative and statistical topics. The position involves overseeing and teaching an enriched range of quantitative courses as well as providing leadership to build the center. We seek a colleague who is expert at statistics and quantitative methodology but also understands the value of qualitative methods. We are especially interested in candidates who can contribute to the diversity and excellence of our academic community through their research, teaching, and service.

RANK: Full Professor (tenured)

SALARY: Commensurate with qualifications and experience

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Applicants must have a Ph.D. in Psychology or related field completed by June 30, 2012. The successful candidate must be able to demonstrate excellence in research and teaching.

POSITION AVAILABLE: July 1, 2012, with academic year commencing Fall 2012. Position is contingent upon final budgetary approval.
