Successful applicants will demonstrate success or strong potential in attracting external funding for their research, and exhibit a record of published scholarship and experience in university teaching. Assistant or Associate Professor - Tenure Track, Fiscal Year with Joint appointment in the Delaware Education Research & Development Center, College of Education and Human Development

Specialization: Program Evaluation of human services for children, youth, and their families

Qualifications: A faculty member is desired with specialization in the evaluation of human services for children, youth, and their families, school-based preventive interventions, and/or nonprofit programming. Externally funded multidisciplinary program evaluation research will be carried out in collaboration with the Delaware Education Research and Development Center (DERDC) - (40% during academic year; 100% during summer). The faculty member will also teach undergraduate and graduate courses related to program development and evaluation, and applied research methods in community settings. Successful grant writing, both state and federal, is expected. Position begins 7/1/13.
