- Provide a forum for the exchange and dissemination of scholarly research, ideas, and best practices to teach, promote, and protect Indigenous languages.

An exceptional, international event, the 2009 conference will center on the theme *"Indigenous Languages Across the Generations – Strengthening Families and Communities."* SILS '09 will continue the conference's traditional emphasis on American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian languages and communities, while broadening its international scope to encourage participation from Africa, Latin America, and the Pacific.
