
Project BEST: Bilingual Educators in Science and Technology

Project BEST offers a wealth of benefits, including the opportunity to earn a master's degree, mentorship from esteemed professionals and a substantial stipend and living allowance.



To find out if you qualify for Project BEST, answer the following questions:


- Are you bilingual in Spanish or Haitian Creole?
- Are you interested in teaching science at a middle or high school level?
- Are you interested in giving back to a community in need?
- Are you a college graduate with a strong background in science?
- Can you devote one year toward intensive study and a clinically rich training program?
- Will you commit to teaching in a high needs district?

Project BEST Scholars receive an abundance of benefits:

- Earn an M.A. in Science Education, with initial New York State certification (grades 7–12) in a science discipline (biology, earth science, physics or chemistry) and a bilingual extension
- Be mentored by highly qualified teachers and University faculty through a one-year, full-time teaching residency
- Complete the first part of your National Board Certification in adolescent science
- Receive a \$10,000 tuition stipend
- Receive a \$30,000 living allowance







Project BEST commences July 2012. All applications must be submitted by February 1, 2012.
