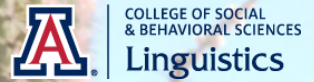

NAMA students complete the program in as little as fifteen months, taking courses in linguistics, anthropology, and American Indian Studies. During summer, students also participate in the American Indian Language Development Institute.
