The LingCologne 2019 Multimodality conference brings to the fore the relevance of conceiving of language in a unified way: encompassing SPOKEN and SIGNED languages, GESTURE and WRITING. Considering multiple channels of expression will highlight the fundamental multimodality and semiotic diversity of language. The conference focuses on a multimodal view of language and provides insights into the interactions of different language modalities (oral-vocal, visual-gestural and written modality) and the systems underlying these interactions.

- gesture and speech
- gesture and sign
- sign and speech or writing
- writing and speech

#### **Call for posters**

We invite submissions of abstracts for poster presentations contributing to the topic of multimodal language. Contributions focusing on various interactions of different language modalities (oral-vocal, visual-gestural and written) are particularly welcome. All abstracts will be peer-reviewed anonymously.

- Abstracts should not exceed **250 words** (excluding references, pictures, tables or diagrams). Abstracts must be anonymized and sent in pdf format via email to lingcologne-2019@uni-koeln.de
- The organizing committee will award **3 Best Poster Awards** to the best three submitted poster abstracts. The prize is the re-imbursement of the travel and accommodation costs in value of up to 500 Euro.
