Research on Creole languages is being carried on in different parts of the world, not only in Creolespeaking areas, but also in Metropolitan France where many Creole speakers reside.

In Paris, the JCLC regroups students from the Universities of Paris III, VII, VIII and X who have undertaken research in various linguistic subfields : phonetics / phonology, morphosyntax, computational linguistics, discourse analysis, text linguistics, oral data analysis, sociolinguistics. Our research work bears on different French-based Creole languages of which we are native speakers, among them, Haitian Creole, Guadelupean Creole, Martiniquean Creole and Mauritian Creole. The JCLC's aim is to study

- the formal and functional properties of Creole language systems;
- those structural traits shared by Creole languages which might point to typological similarities.

The JCLC invites Postgraduate students to submit abstracts for its Second Workshop on Creole languages. Presentations may cover, but are not restricted to, the following points:

- Formal characteristics of Creole languages
- Changes undergone by functional and lexical items of source languages in language creation
- Parallel and divergent paths in the internal history of Creoles
- Evidence for a typology of grammaticalization phenomena in Creoles
- Acquisition of Creole languages in diglossic speech communities
- Phonetic and/or phonological features that distinguish Creoles from their source language(s)
- Didactic applications of studies on Creole languages.
