The inaugural Margaret Florey Scholarship will support one Indigenous language worker to attend the International Conference on Language Documentation & Conservation (ICLDC), from February 28 - March 3, 2019 in Honolulu. The conference brings together linguists, students, and community activists to share resources and research, and discuss important issues in documenting and revitalising the world's endangered languages.

- The scholarship, valued at \$500, includes conference registration plus a contribution towards accommodation costs
