Do you want to be a Language teacher?

The Master of Indigenous Languages Education (MILE) program is designed for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander educators who wish to develop their knowledge and skills as teachers and specialise in any of Australia's first languages.

Program Requirements

MILE is a one-year (two semester) degree, open to applicants who have a recognised teaching qualification such as a four-year teaching degree or a Bachelor degree and Diploma of Education, and at least one year full-time teaching experience since graduation.

You will complete eight units of study including linguistics and languages education, curriculum development, technology in languages education and a substantial classroom-based research project.

This program is open to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander candidates only and is delivered in block mode. You will attend the University for three one-week blocks each semester.

Because so many languages are currently in a process of revitalisation, there is no language proficiency requirement for entry to or award of the Masters.

Online applications are now open and close on **Thursday 31 October 2019**.

Classes begin in January 2020.
