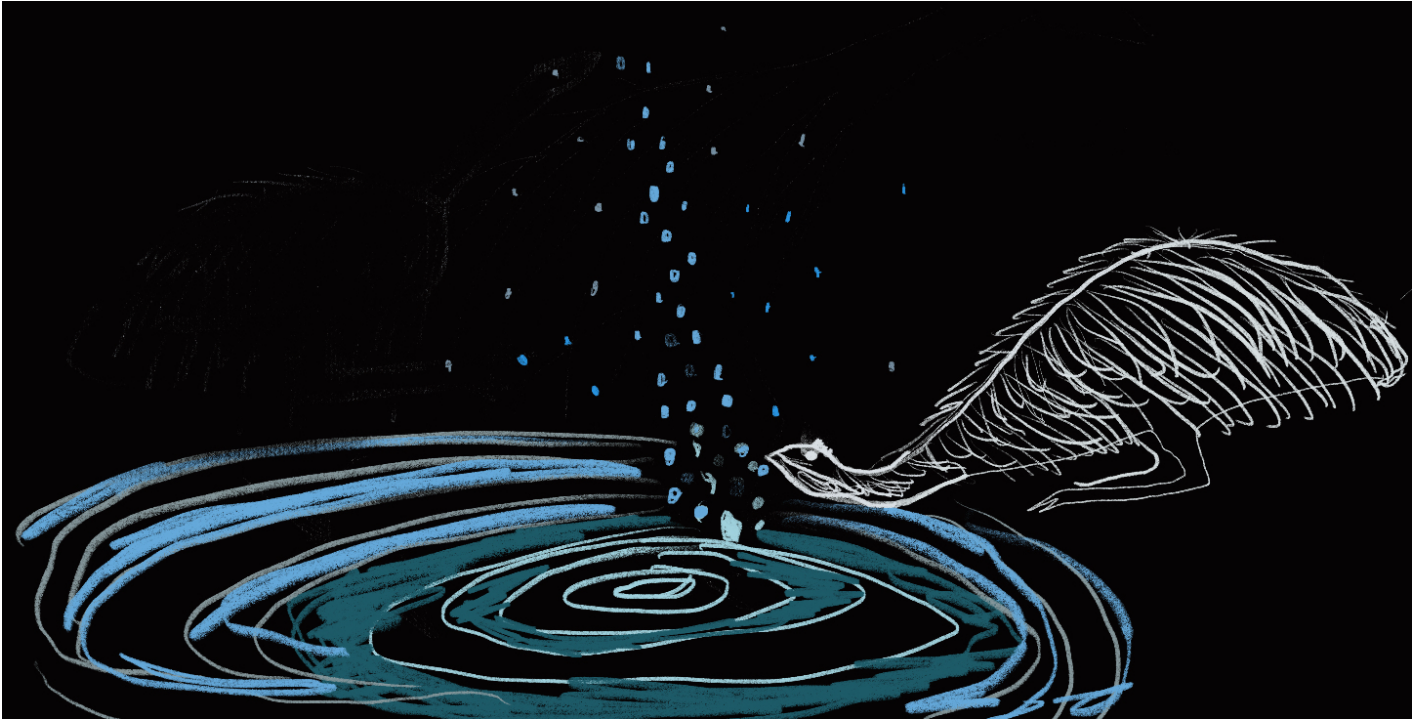


Master of Indigenous Languages Education (MILE)

The Master of Indigenous Languages Education (MILE) program is designed for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander teachers who wish to develop their skills and specialise in any of Australia's first languages.

Program Requirements

MILE is a one-year two-semester degree, open to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander candidates with a recognised teaching qualification (a Bachelor of Education or a Bachelor degree and Diploma of Education) and at least one year full-time teaching experience since graduation. There is no language proficiency requirement for entry to the program.

Students attend the University for three one-week blocks each semester. Class dates for 2021 are
Semester 1: 17-23 Jan, 21-26 Feb, 12-16 Apr
Semester 2: 5-9 July, 23-27 Aug, 27 Sept – 1 Oct.

You will complete eight units of study including linguistics, curriculum development and technology for languages education, and a substantial classroom-based research project.

Applications are now open, and close **31 October**. Classes begin in **January 2021**.
