The Department of Specialized Education Services, School of Education, University of North Carolina at Greensboro announces the availability of a tenure-track associate or assistant professor position in the Professions in Deafness programs. The Professions in Deafness programs are housed in the Department of Specialized Education Services and consist of the following programs: American Sign Language (ASL)/Deaf Studies; Community – Based Services; and Deaf Education - Teacher Licensure.

Context:

The University of North Carolina at Greensboro is a doctoral granting institution in the University of North Carolina system with a Fall 2007 enrollment of approximately 17,000 students, of whom approximately 23% are graduate students. The Department of Specialized Education Services offers undergraduate programs in the education of Deaf children, interpreting, ASL teacher licensure, learning and behavioral/emotional disabilities, and early childhood special education.

Qualifications:

1. An earned doctoral degree in Deaf Studies, ASL linguistics, or a related field. ABD with a graduation date no later than August 1, 2008 is acceptable.
2. Experience teaching ASL /Deaf Studies courses at the post-secondary level.
3. Current ASLTA certification.
4. Fluency in American Sign Language.
5. Actively involved in the Deaf Community.

Responsibilities:

1. Coordinate newly established undergraduate program in ASL Teacher Licensure
2. Teach undergraduate courses related to ASL, linguistics of ASL, Deaf culture, curriculum development and methods of teaching ASL.
3. Participate actively in student recruitment, retention, and advising.
4. Participate in curriculum/program development and evaluation.
5. Contribute to the instructional, research, and service mission of the Department of Specialized Education Services, the School of Education, and the University.

Salary: Competitive and commensurate with experience and qualifications.

Starting date: August 1, 2008

Application deadline: December 30, 2007. Review of applications will continue until the position is filled.

Application Procedure: Send a letter of application, vita, three letters of recommendation, transcripts and a video describing in ASL your philosophy/method(s) of teaching.
